

9.12 "MARCH ON DENVER"

"March On Denver", a state-wide rally in conjunction with the national taxpayer rally, was held at the state capitol in Denver on September 12th. Several grassroots activist groups, such as ROAR, along with many concerned citizens bonded together as responsible Americans seeking common sense government. Many carried homemade signs expressing desire that our Representatives adhere to the constitution, stop excessive government spending, and not lead us down the socialist path. The theme of "Taxed Enough Already", which was the original basis of the national Tea Parties being founded, was clearly relayed in Washington, D. C. and Denver gatherings. Two particular issues that were most prominent and expressed by the signs and speakers in the Denver event was "Health Care Reform" and "Cap and Trade". Both of these bills will be voted on in the near future by our Representatives.

Speakers at the 9.12 "March On Denver" included Jason Lewis of KHOW, Jon Caldara of Independence Institute, Amy Oliver of KFKA, and Ari Armstrong of Free Colorado. There was live, patriotic music by Citizen Pain and a food drive for the Denver Rescue Mission.

It was announced by one of the speakers that there were approximately 4,000 people in attendance at the peaceful Denver rally. Further reports by People's Press Collective (PPC) the next day indicated "over 2,000 people showed up". Regardless of whether it was 2,000 or 4,000 people participating in the 9.12 "March On Denver", ROAR welcomed the opportunity to show our support for common sense government and to participate in the march to "REVIVE OUR AMERICAN REPUBLIC"
